PROCLAMATION SUSPENDING BURNING PERMITS

On State Responsibility Areas within Amador and the west slope of El Dorado Counties

Due to the menace of wildfires and their potential to destroy life and property, and utilizing the authority vested in me by Section 4423.1 of the Public Resources Code, and by the Governor's Executive Order, I hereby proclaim that **ALL BURNING PERMITS** within State Responsibility Areas of Amador and the west slope of El Dorado Counties will be **SUSPENDED** beginning at 08:00 hours July 1, 2010, and will continue in place until formally cancelled by me.

Past fire history combined with dry vegetation, predicted fire weather, and other factors, have prompted me to proclaim the following types of burning restrictions and exceptions:

Restrictions:

- All residential "Dooryard" (form LE-62) Burning Permits will be **SUSPENDED** beginning at 08:00 hours July 1, 2010. Previously issued "Dooryard" permits will no longer be valid.
- All Project Burn Permits (form LE-5) must be inspected and approved before a permit can be reissued.

Exceptions:

- Campfires within organized campgrounds or on private property must be maintained in such a manner as to prevent the campfire from spreading to the wildland vegetation.
- Project Burn Permit (LE-5's) may be issued by the Department whenever it can be shown that burning or open flame is essential for reasons of agriculture emergencies, public health, safety and welfare.

This PROCLAMATION is issued at Camino, California, this 23rd day of June 2010.
