Starting Point – Oak Woodlands and Study Area Defined

- California Fire and Resource Assessment Program (FRAP) Mapping of Oak Woodland Habitat Types
- Wildlife Habitat Relationship (WHR) Types as Defined by CA Department of Fish and Game
- 5 WHR Oak Woodland Types: Valley Oak, Blue Oak, Blue Oak- Foothill Pine, Montane Hardwood, and Montane Hardwood-Conifer
- 4,000-Foot Elevation and Other Planning Area Characteristics Consistent with 2004 GP EIR



Scope: OWMP Purposes

- To Fulfill the Requirements of General Plan Implementation Measure CO-P
- To Develop the Policy 7.4.4.4 Option B Fee Method for Mitigating Impacts to Oak Woodlands
- To Establish a Conservation Plan that Is the Initial Oak Woodland Component of the County's INRMP under General Plan Policy 7.4.2.8, and Is Consistent with the CA Oak Woodland Conservation Act



Process: IOWH Mapping Criteria and Filters


- Valley Oak Woodland Designated as “Sensitive Habitat” per General Plan EIR
- Large Expanses (500 Acres or Larger) of Oak Woodlands per Policy 7.4.2.8
- Developed and Undeveloped Parcels 40 Acres and Larger (Limited Existing and Potential Fragmentation)



Process: IOWH Mapping Criteria and Filters (Cont.)

- Undeveloped Parcels (10 Acres and Larger) for Future Identification of Riparian and Other Oak Woodland Corridors
- Community Regions/Rural Centers Excluded
- Industrial and Commercial Lands Excluded





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


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Next Steps: Key Issues and Actions for Completing the OWMP

- Complete Draft IOWH Map: Review Aerial Photos, Add Montane Riparian Woodland, and Perform Quality Assurance Reviews
- Address Issue Regarding Removal of IOWH from LDR Designations
- Complete Draft OWMP, Option B Fee, CEQA Document, and Implementing Ordinance for Public Review

Option B Fees – Planning Commission Recommended Alternative

Option B Fees Based on PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION 100% RURAL/100% EASEMENT

	Per Acre
Acquisition ⁽¹⁾	\$ 2,900
Restoration	\$ 2,100
Management	\$ 1,200
Monitoring	\$ 2,300
Total Cost/Fee Per Acre	\$ 8,500

(1) 100% rural acquisition and conservation easements on 40+ acre parcels. Includes management fee for easement contract review.



Additional Notes on Planning Commission Option B Fee Recommendation

1. Rural acquisition cost based on rural land property for sale using Metro Listing Service (MLS), November 2006. The easement value is assumed 20% of fee title for 40+ acres.
2. Low Restoration costs include removal of non-native species and planting 200 oak seedlings, or 600 acorns, per acre.
3. Low Management costs include weed control, fuels treatment, and some management planning.
4. Annual monitoring for the first four years, with monitoring every other year thereafter through year 10. Cost includes an endowment, 10% contingency, and 20% administration cost.
