**The El Dorado County Public
Defender's Office presents its next
Clean Slate Clinic**

If you were convicted of misdemeanors or felonies in El Dorado County over one year ago that resulted in jail time, alternative sentencing, or probation, you may be eligible to "clean up" your criminal record. At this clinic, you will receive information on whether you are eligible to petition the Court for a dismissal of certain convictions in California. If you were convicted in El Dorado County and successfully completed all the terms of your sentence, you will receive instructions on how to "clean up" your record. *Please note that getting your conviction dismissed may not restore your right to bear firearms.*

We will help you organize your petition and motion to dismiss if you are eligible and come prepared!

You are ONLY eligible for this service IF:

- Your conviction was over one year ago,
- You are finished with probation,
- You have paid 100% of Court fines, fees, and restitution,
- You did not serve any time in State Prison for this offense,
- You are NOT presently charged with the commission of any offense (including VOP),
- You are NOT currently on Parole or PRCS.

VETERANS may qualify to have their records sealed.

Certain offenses are **not eligible** for dismissal, including convictions of Section 2800, 2801, or 2803 of the Vehicle Code, or for Sections 286(c), 288, 288a(c), 288.5, or 289(j) of the California Penal Code.

WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU

WE CAN ONLY PROVIDE SERVICES
IF YOU BRING THE FOLLOWING:

1. Identification—i.e. Driver's License, Passport, or California Identification Card.
2. Case number, exact date of conviction, and exact charges (we cannot look this up for you). If unsure, please visit the Clerk of Courts ahead of time.
3. Your own interpreter, if necessary
