

According to El Dorado County Tax Collector, K. E. Coleman, the State Controller's Property Tax Postponement Program is accepting applications through February 10, 2019.

This program allows taxpayers who are 62 years of age or older, blind or disabled, with an annual household income of \$35,500 or less and who have 40 percent equity in their homes to apply for a deferral of property taxes on their principal residence. The program defers payment of property taxes until the homeowner moves or sells the property, transfers title, defaults on a senior lien, refinances, dies or chooses to obtain a reverse mortgage.

The application filing period for the fiscal year 2018-2019 is October 1, 2018 to February 10, 2019.

Requirements are subject to change without notice if the law is revised, and available funding is limited from year to year.
