

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1986 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1986 is \$36,798,200 -- an increase of approximately 3,000,000. The increase is directly attributed to an additional \$5,000,000 in the timber industry. The fruit industry reflects a \$2,000,000 decrease, primarily because of a short crop. Livestock and poultry have remained constant. The County's fruit and nut industry are continuing to change and expand. The pear industry continues to decrease in acreage and production.

The County's roadside marketing program is continuing to expand throughout the County. The ranch marketing program sponsored by the Agricultural Council, El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce is also expanding rapidly. This ranch marketing program, coupled with the recreational industry, is proving to be extremely beneficial to the County's economic base. Interest in this program continues to increase throughout the western slope of the County.

The monetary values recorded in this report are F.O.B. the plant and do not reflect net returns or profits realized by the grower.
