

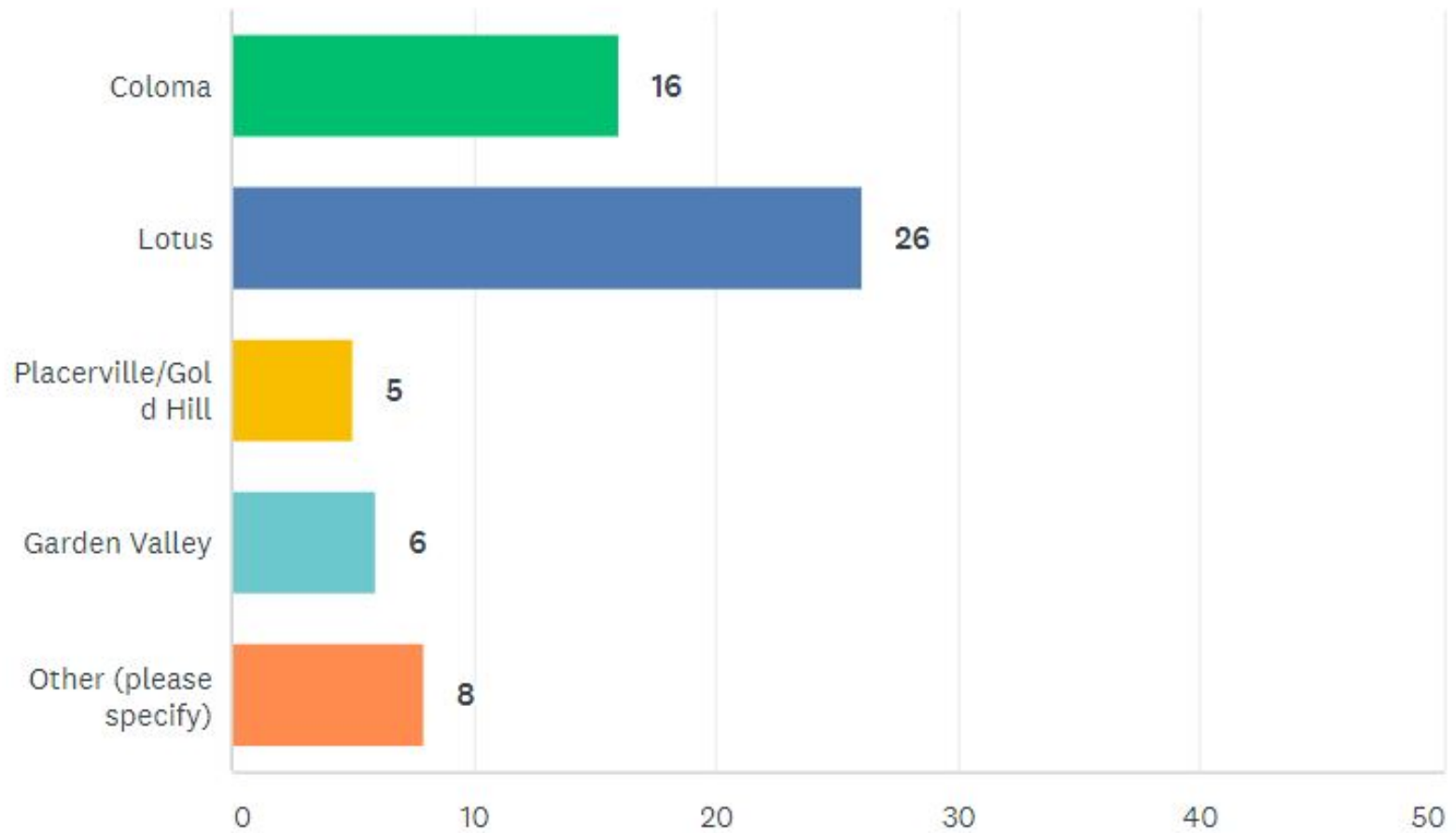
Coloma-Lotus Survey Results

Which City/Town do you live in?

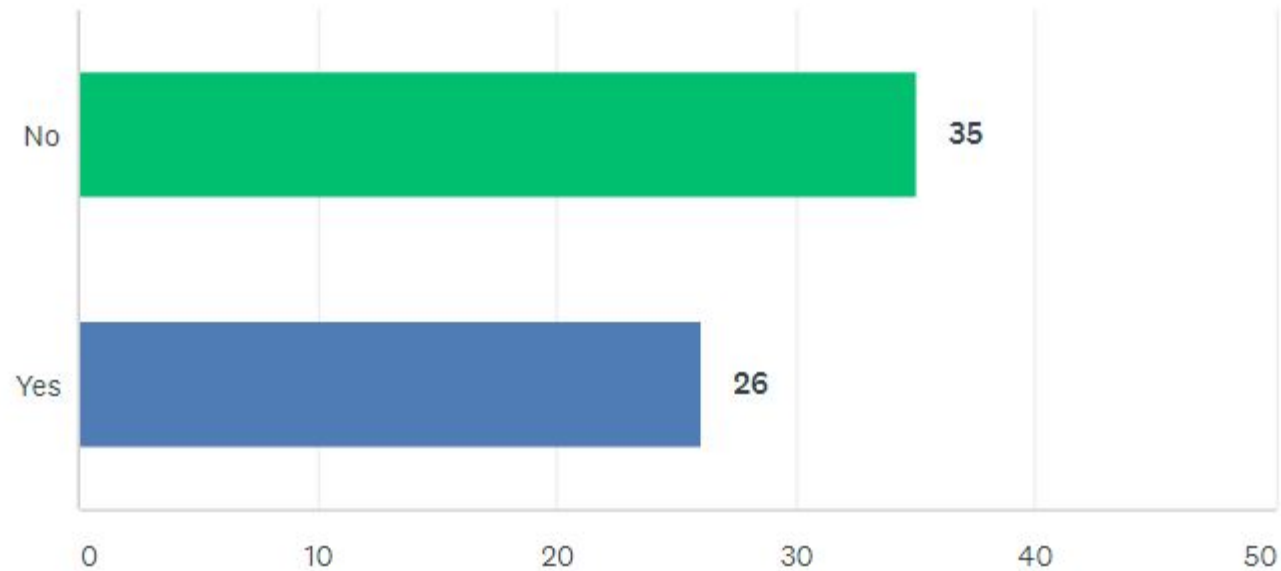

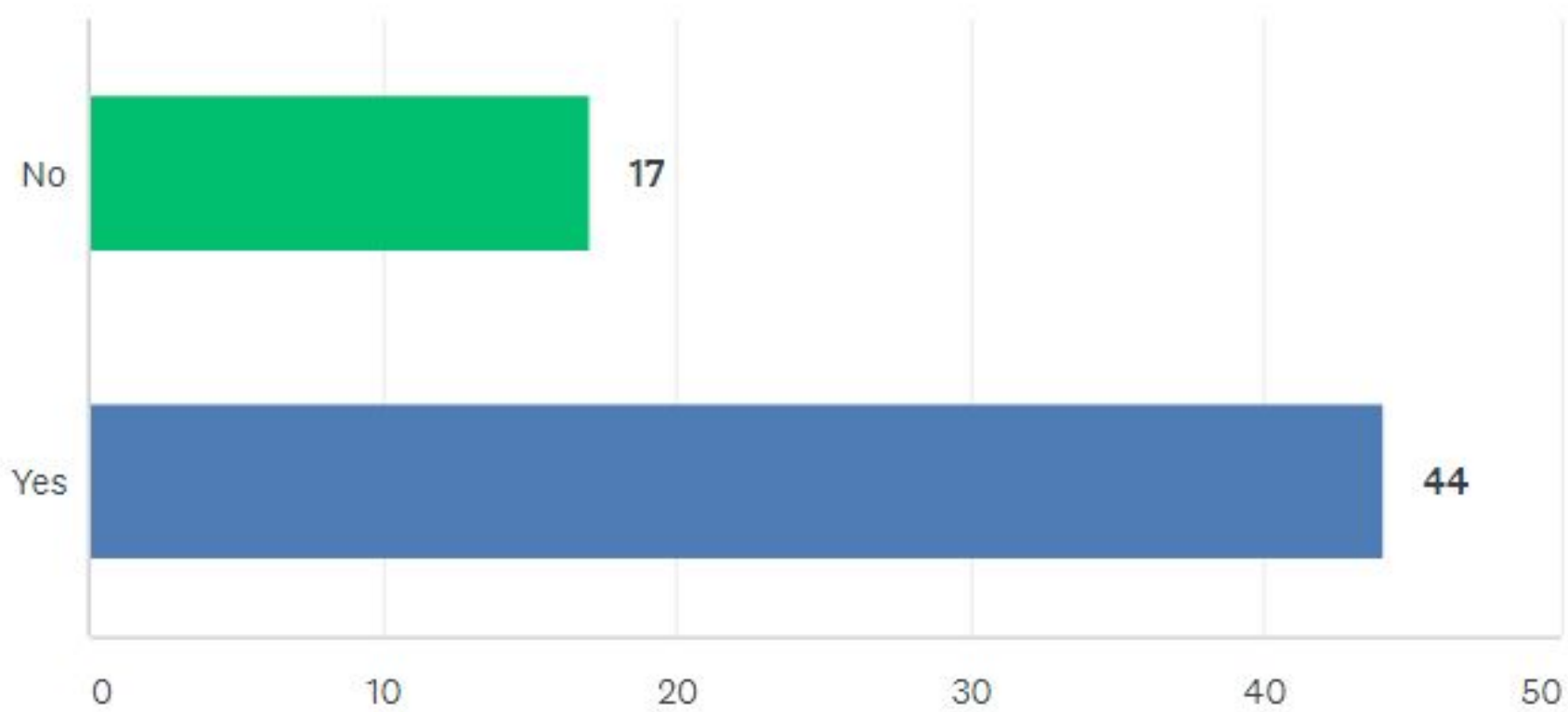

Q4 - Creating ad hoc and sub committees

*Ad hoc committee: A temporary advisory committee composed solely of less than a quorum of the legislative body that serves a limited or single purpose, that is not perpetual, and that will be dissolved once its specific task is completed IS NOT subject to the Brown Act.

*Standing committees of a legislative body, irrespective of their composition, have either: (1) a continuing subject matter jurisdiction, or (2) a meeting schedule fixed by charter, ordinance, resolution, or formal action of a legislative body. Even if comprised of less than a quorum of the governing body, a standing committee IS subject to the Brown Act.

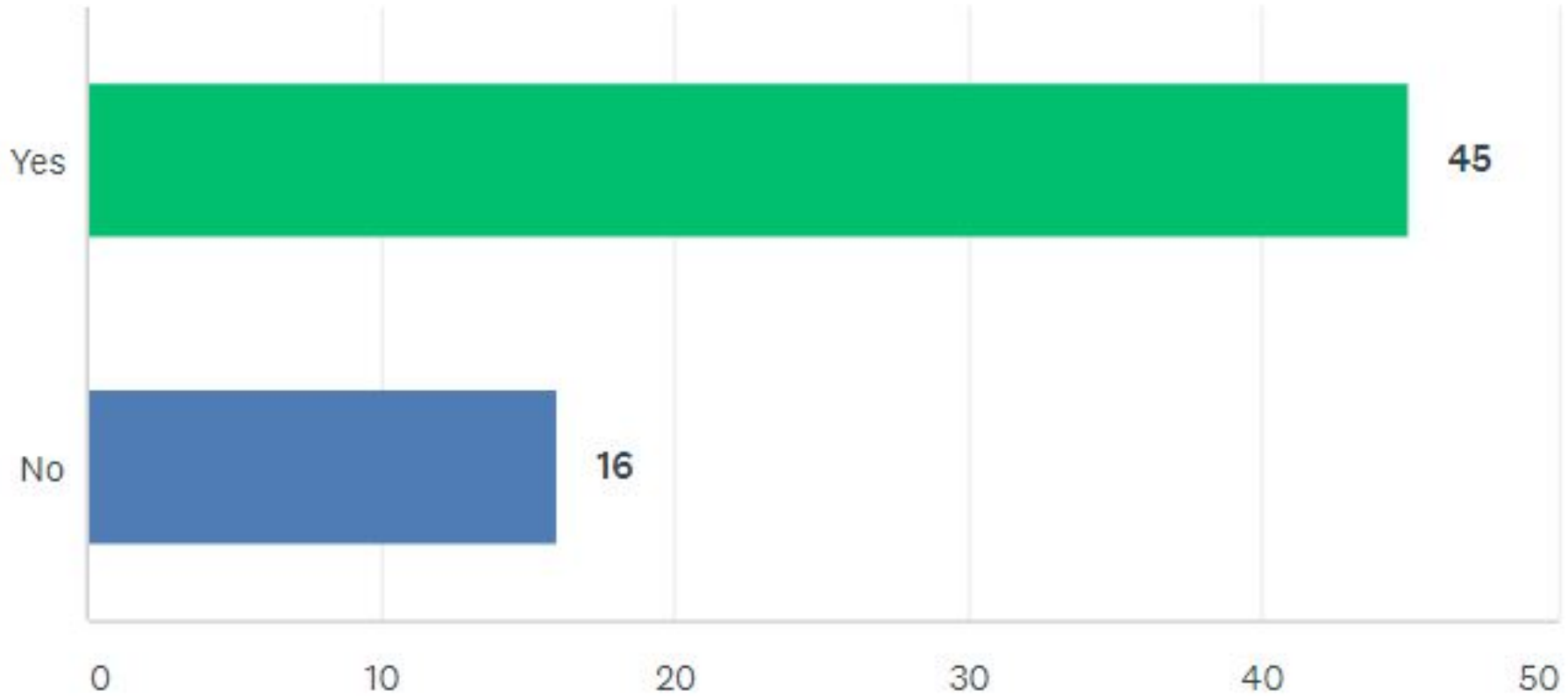
Q5 - Making written public comments

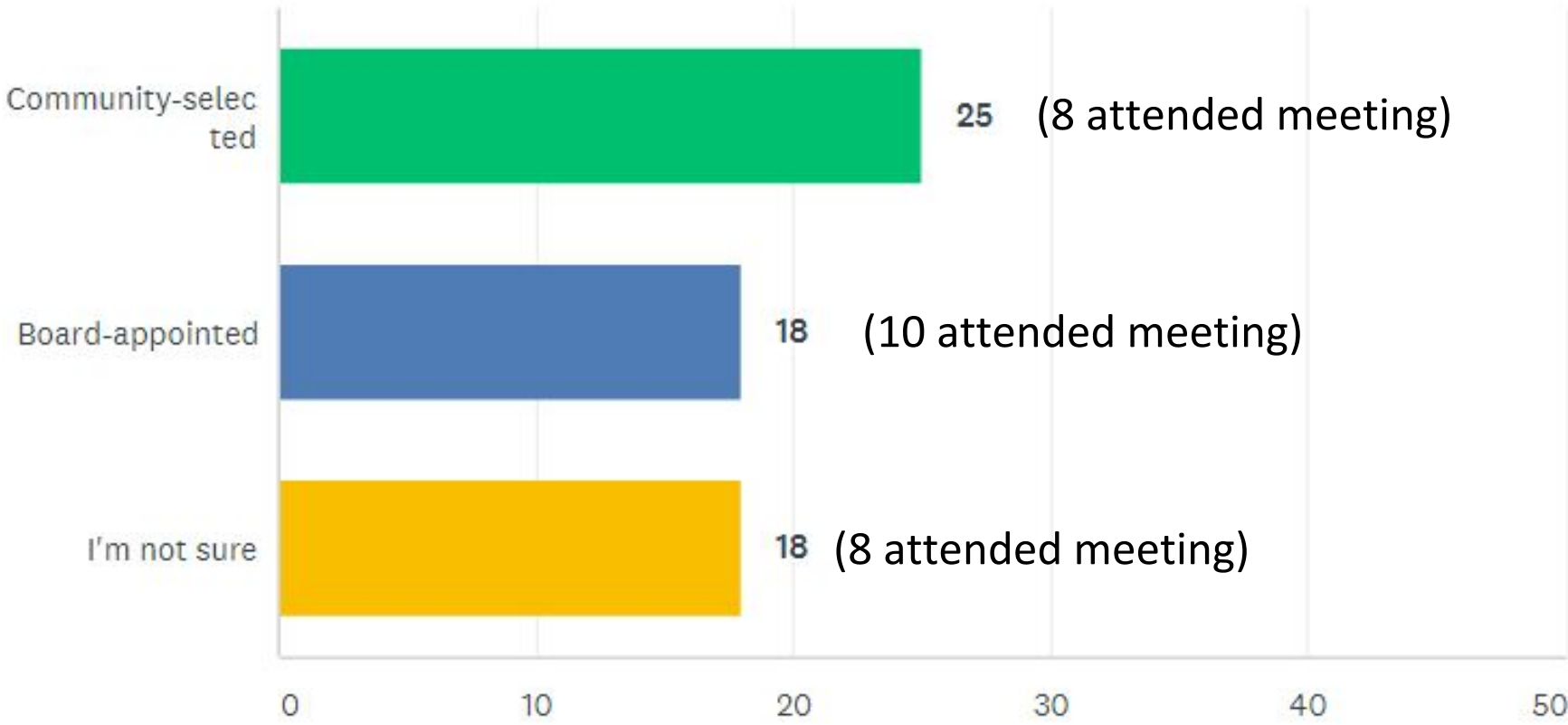
***A community-selected committee may choose to send agendas and notes through its own distribution channels. Community-selected committees determine their own rules for written public comment.

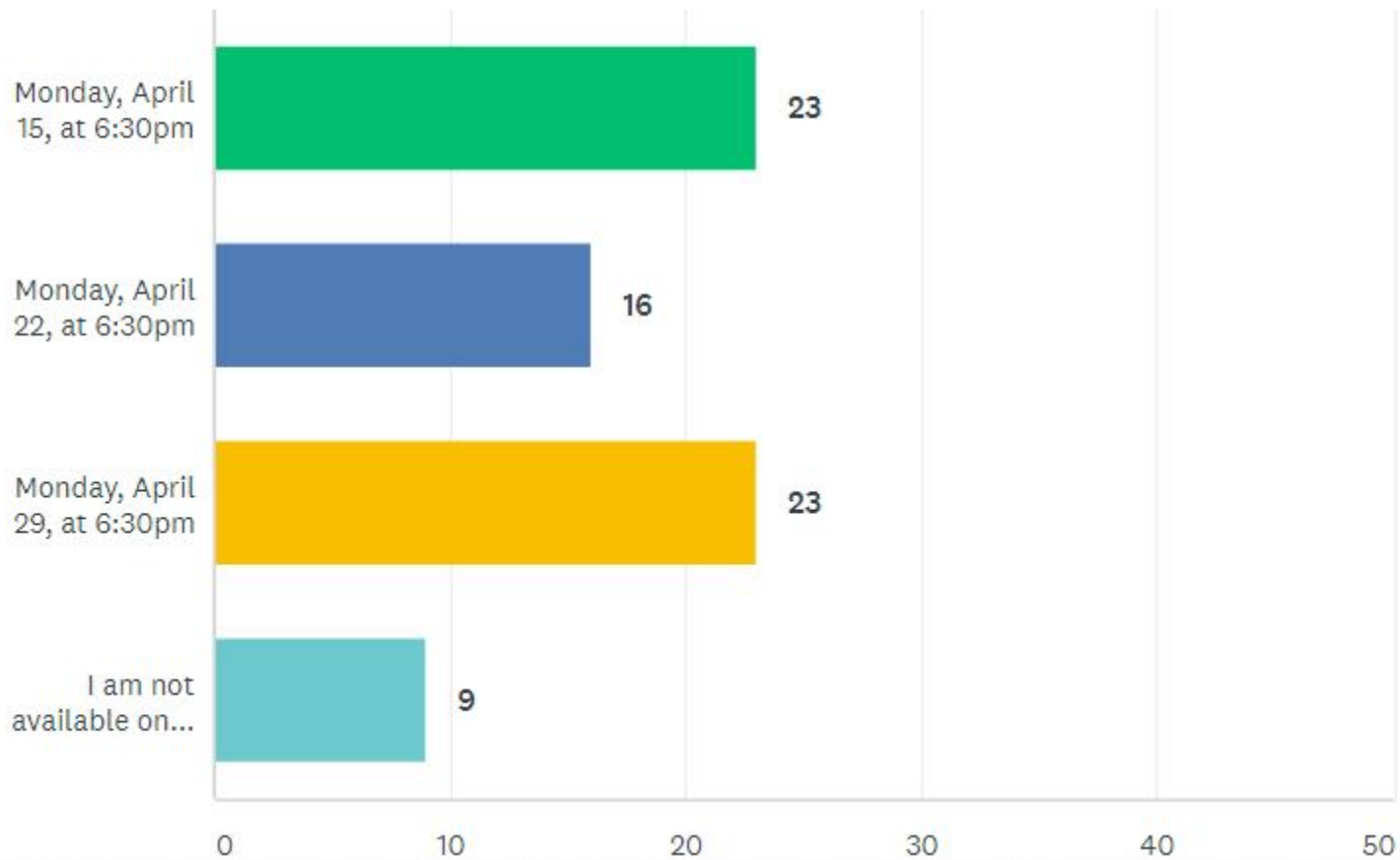

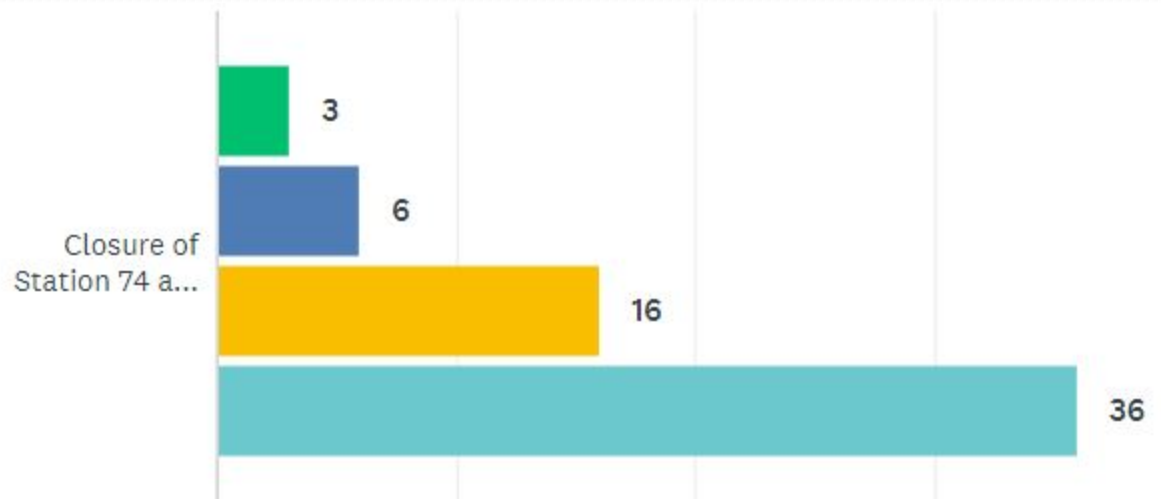

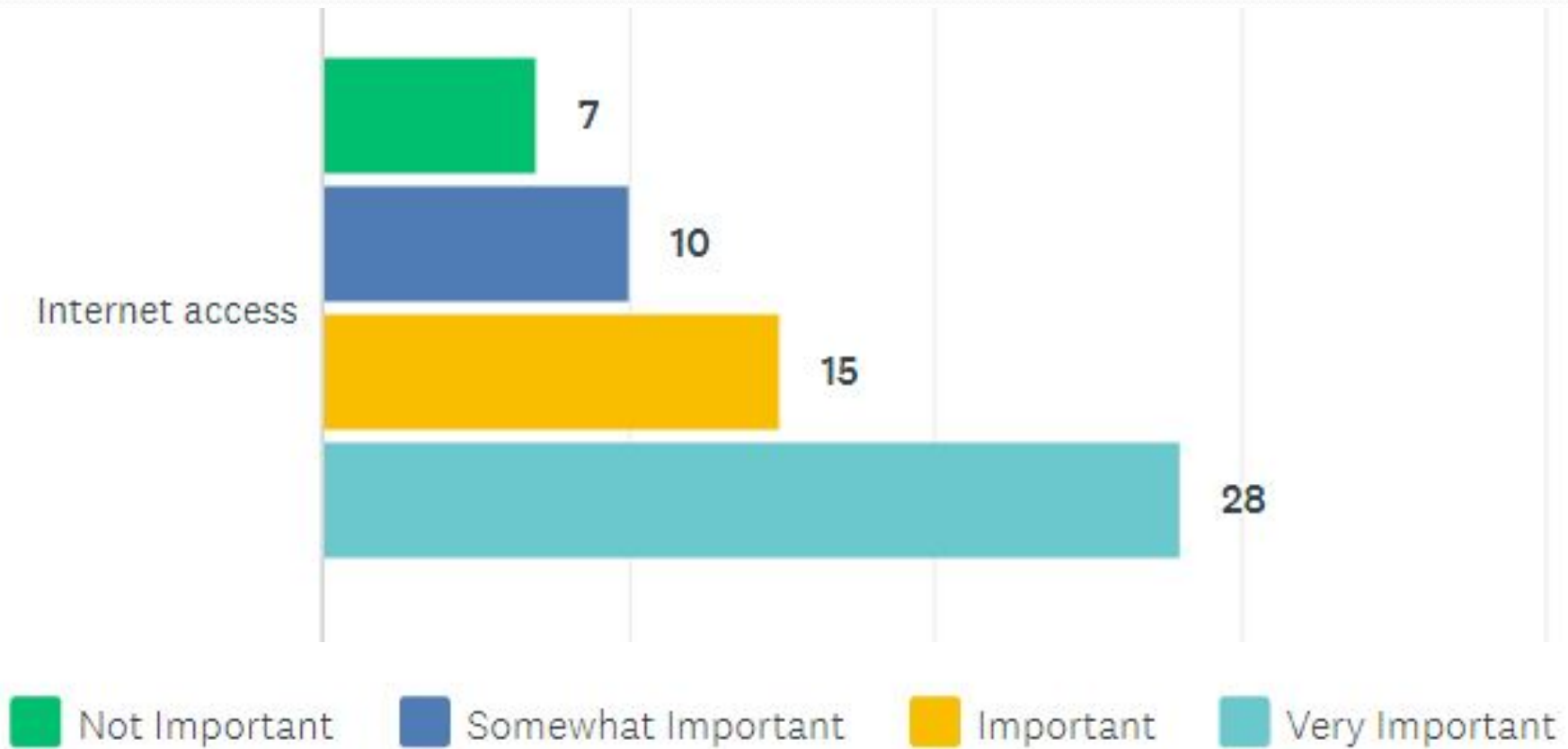
Ranking of topics from discussion at 3-18-19 meeting

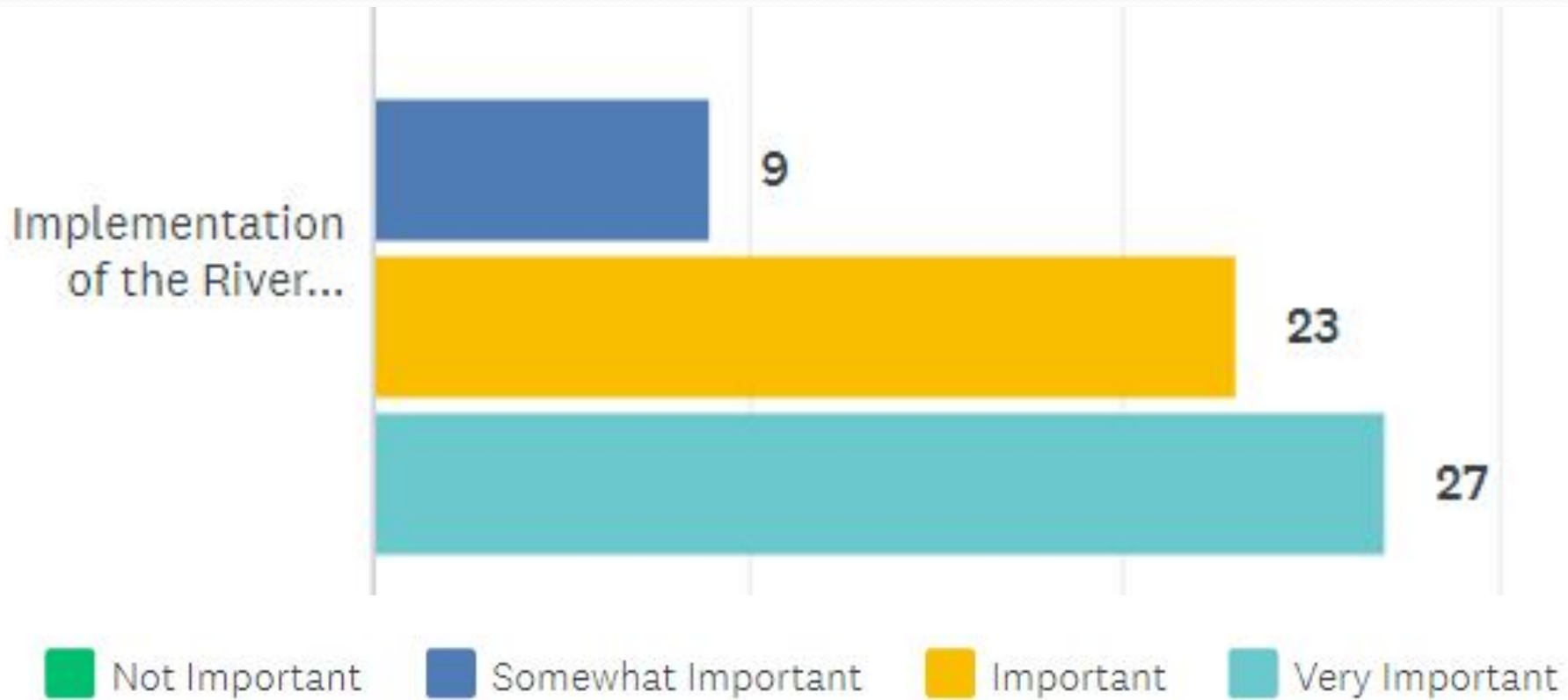

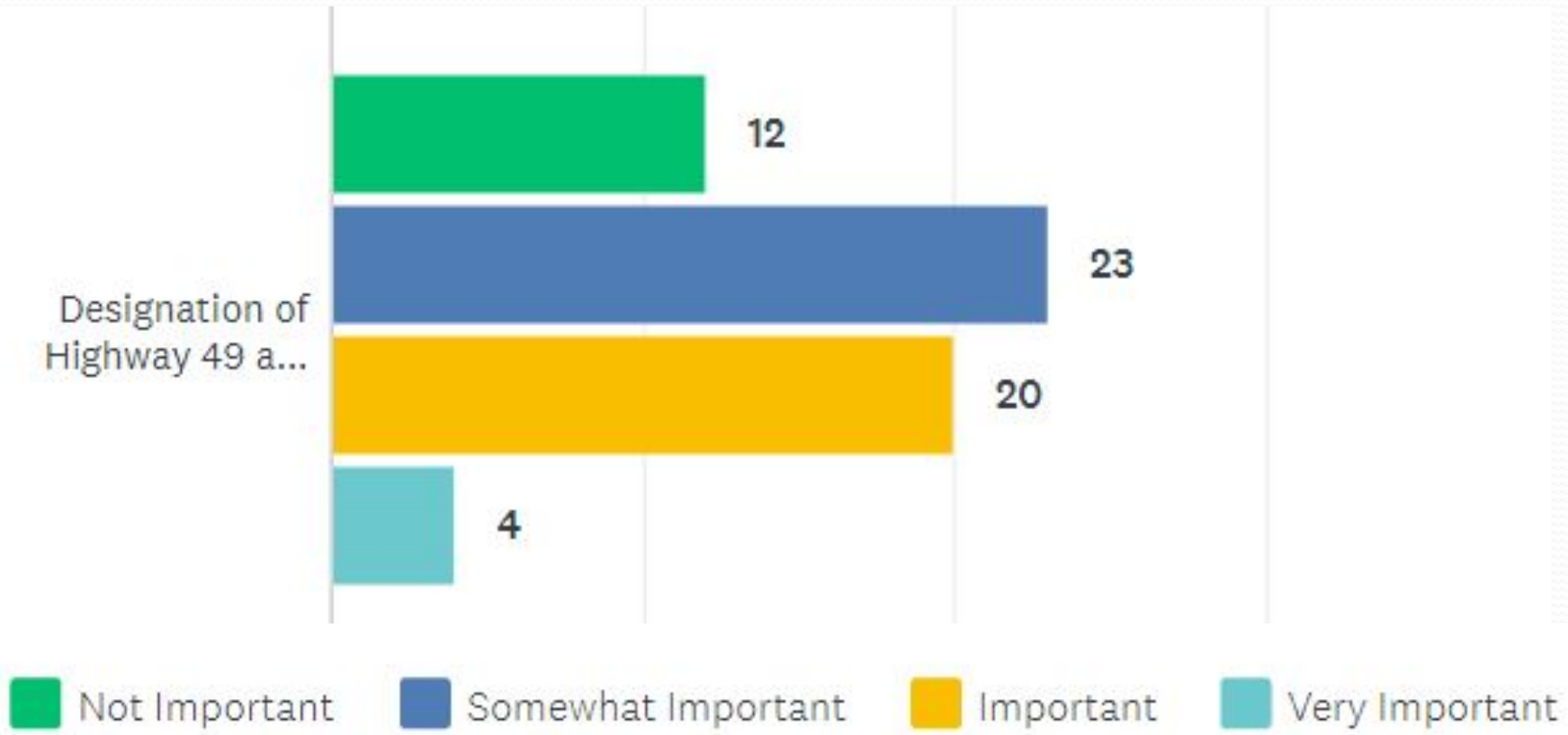

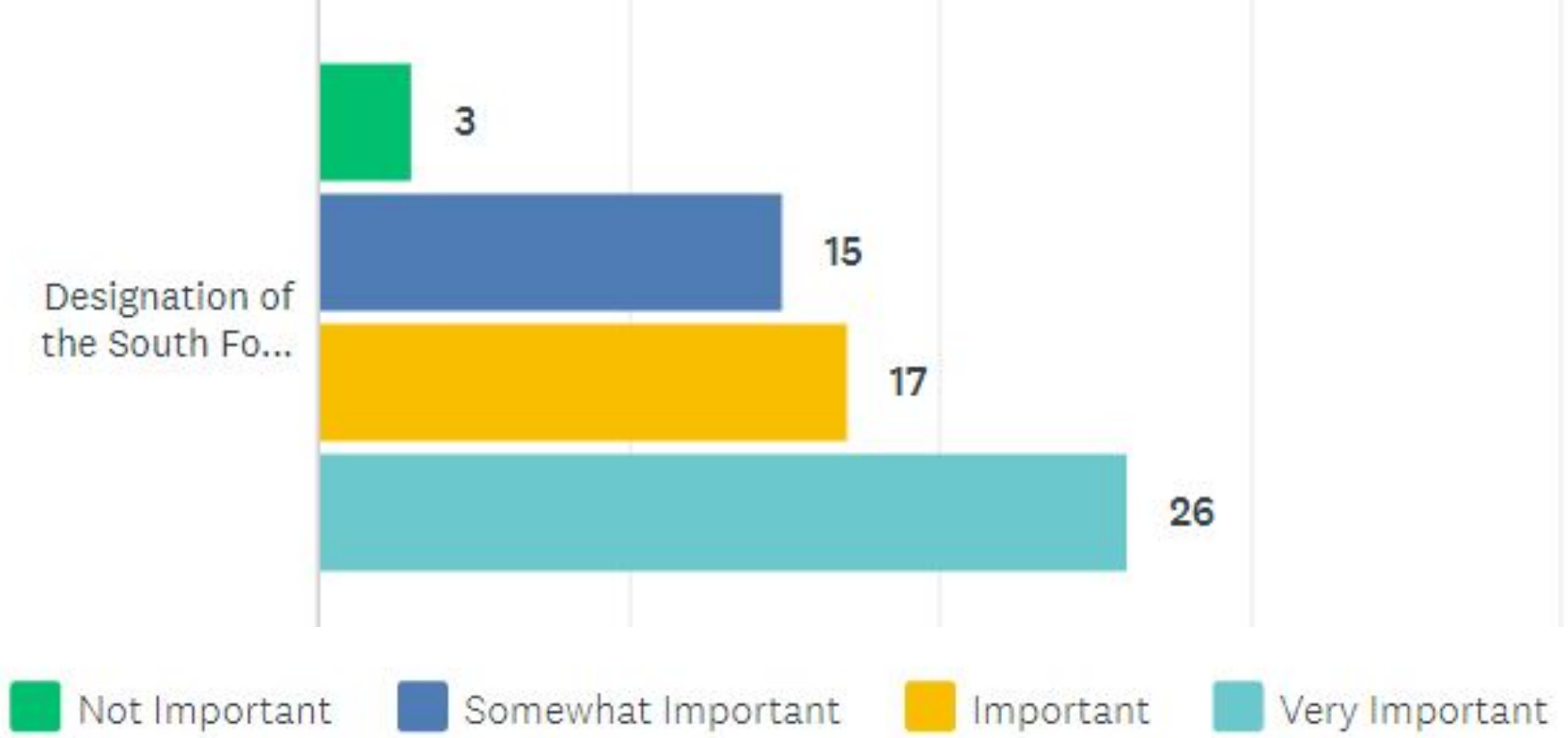
Ranking – Implementing RMP



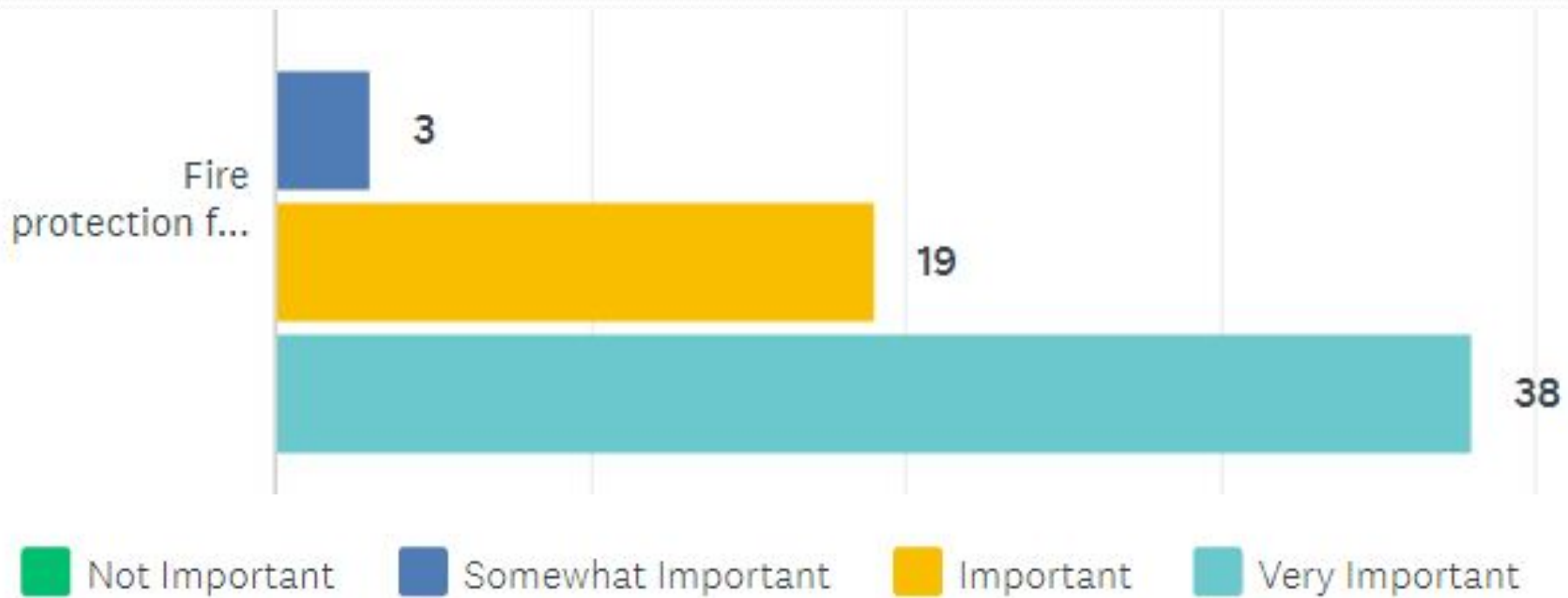
Ranking – Highway 49 Designation as Scenic Highway



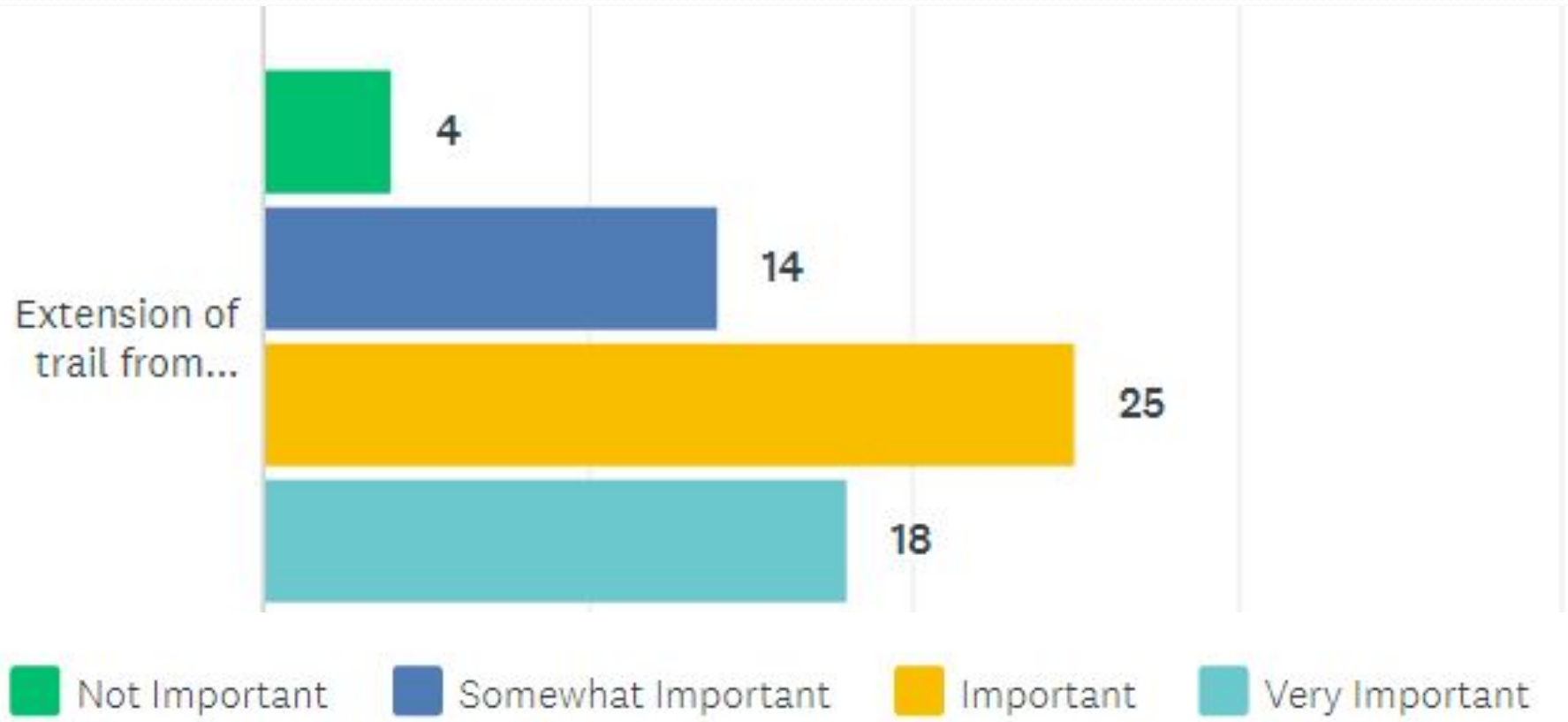
Ranking – Designation of South Fork American River as Wild and Scenic



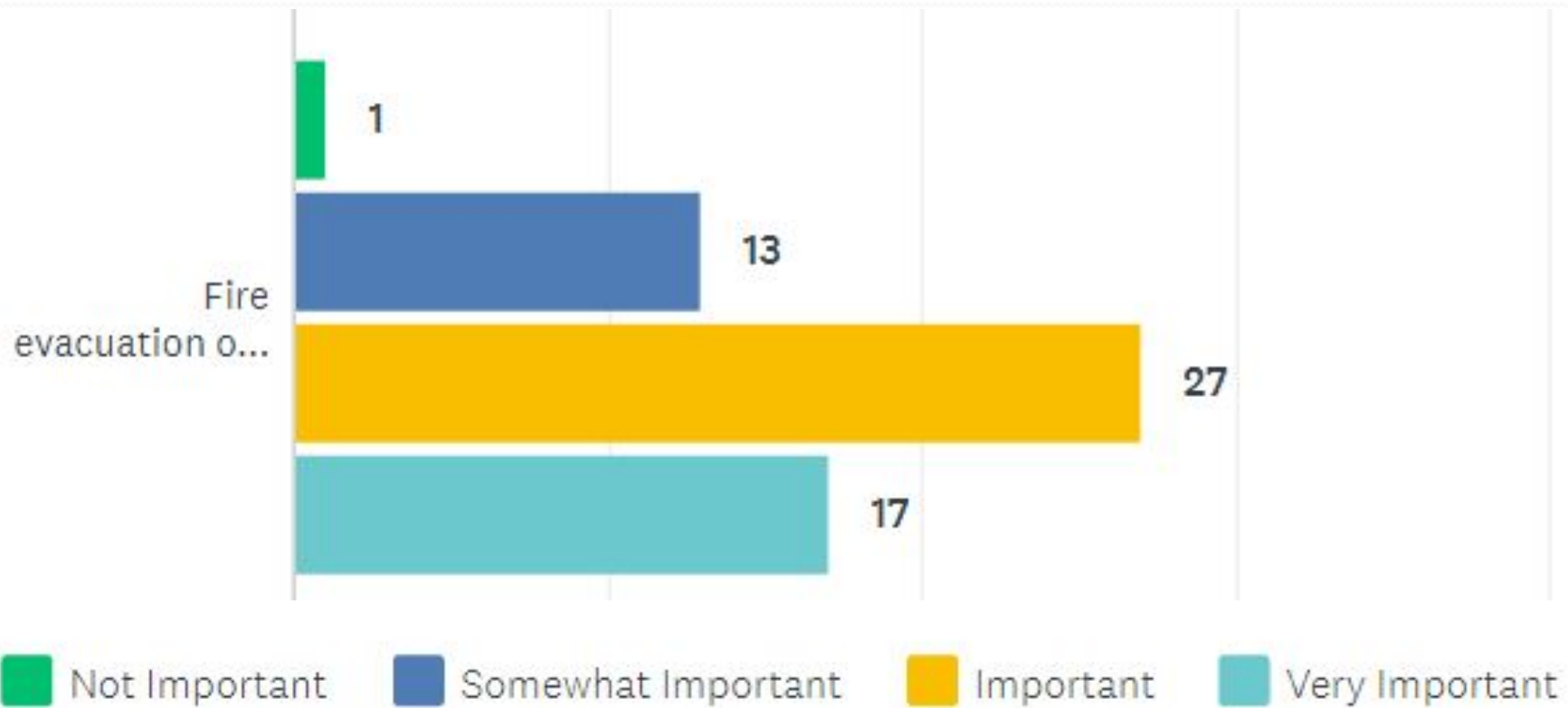

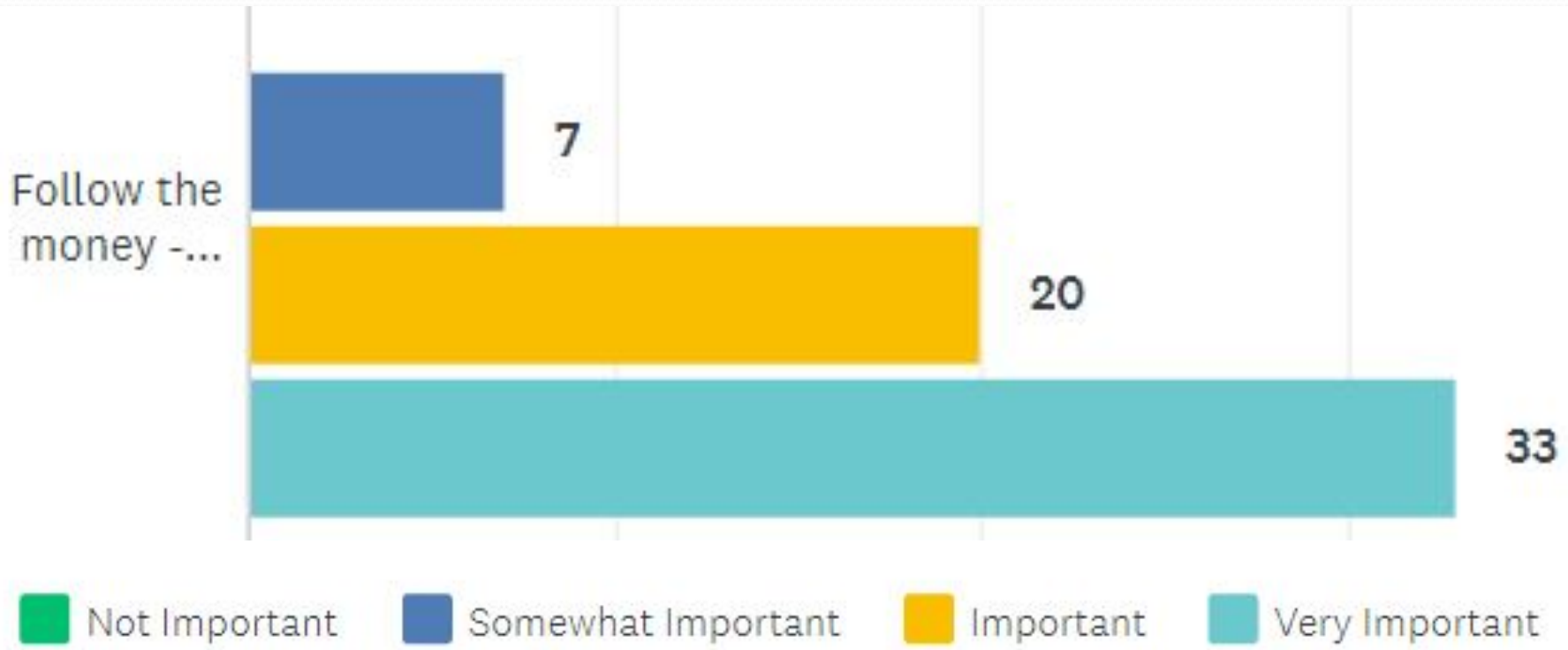
Ranking – Extension of trail from Coloma-Lotus to Greenwood



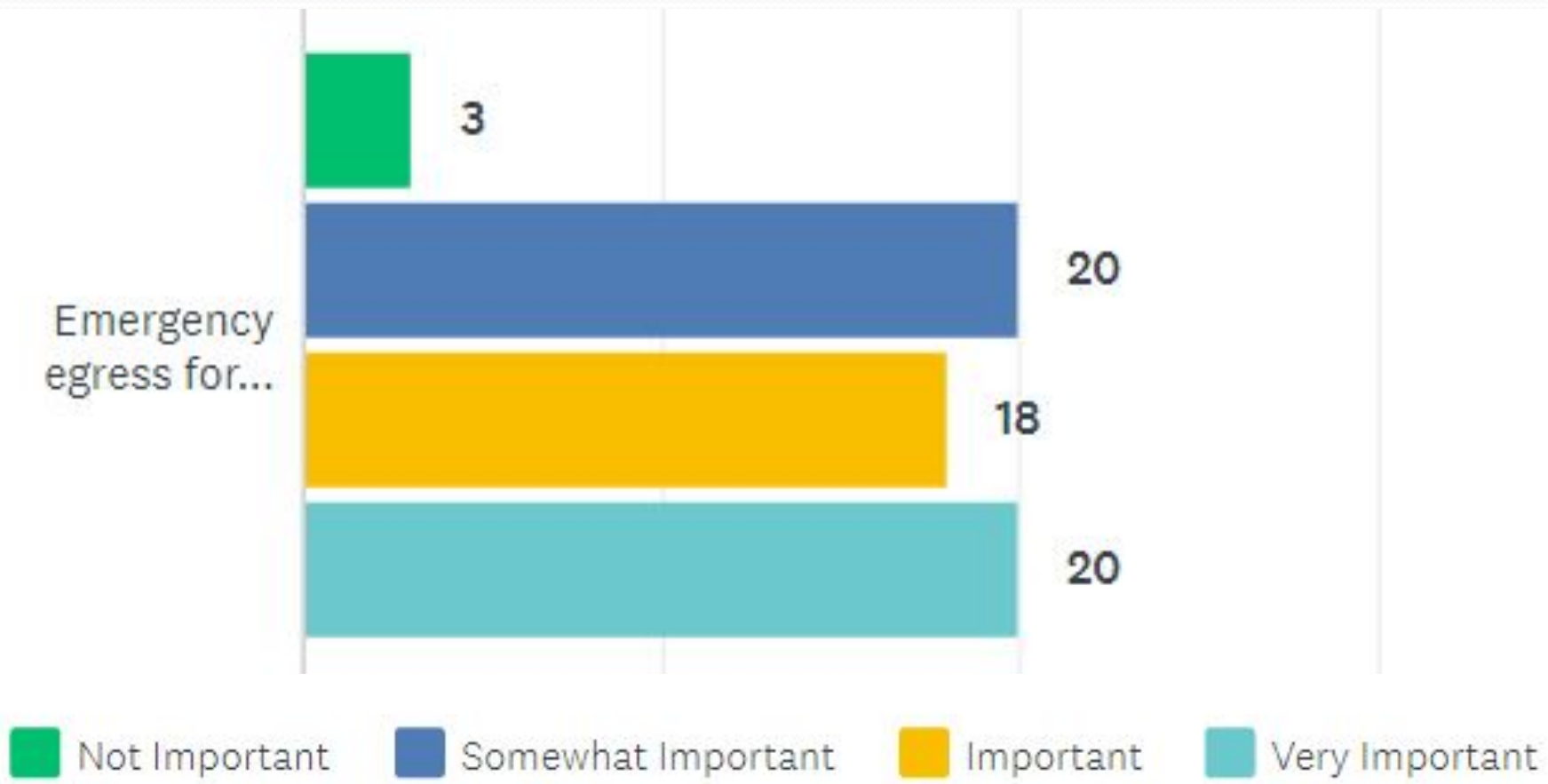
Ranking – Fire evacuation of river camps and school visitors



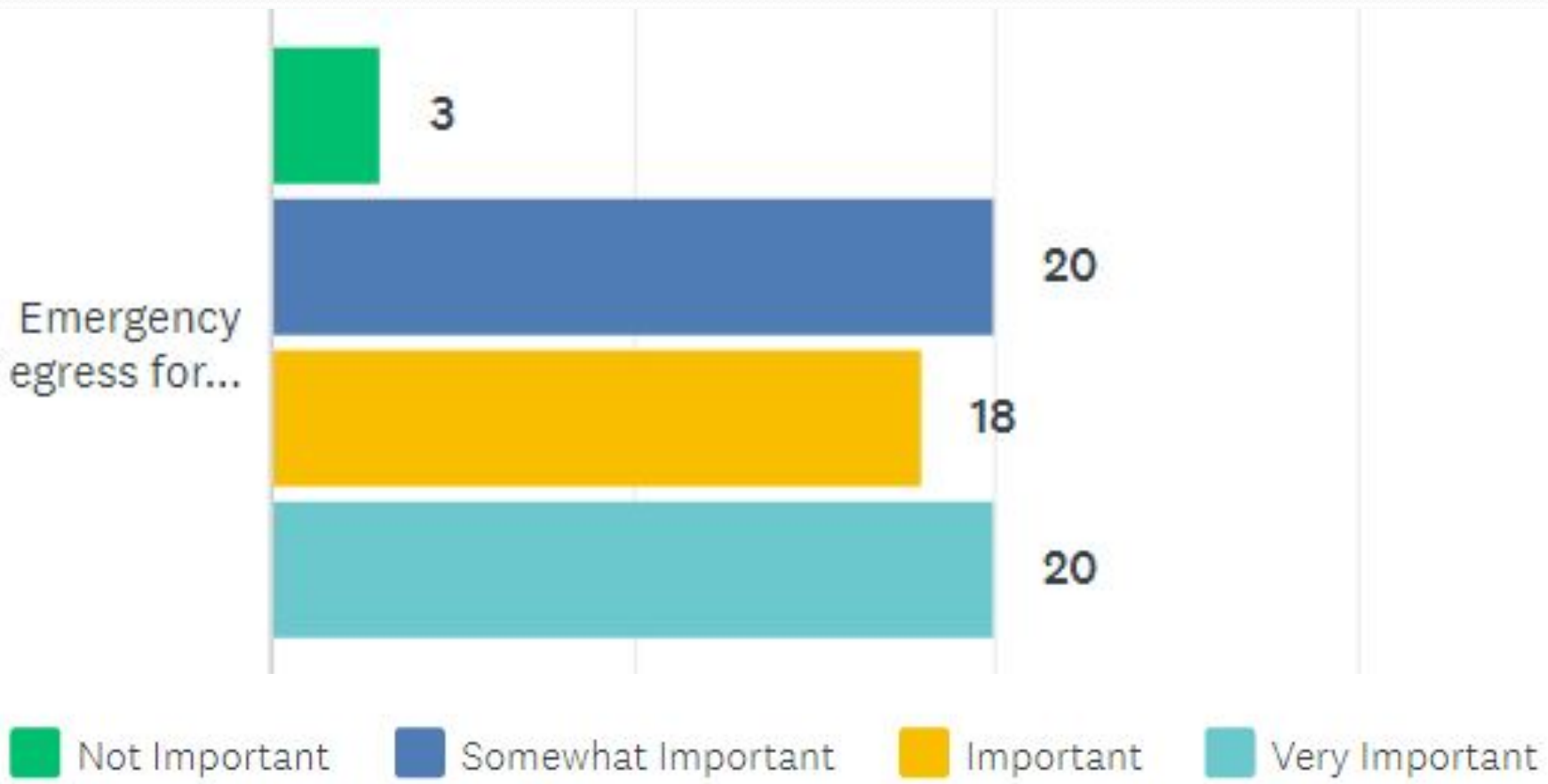

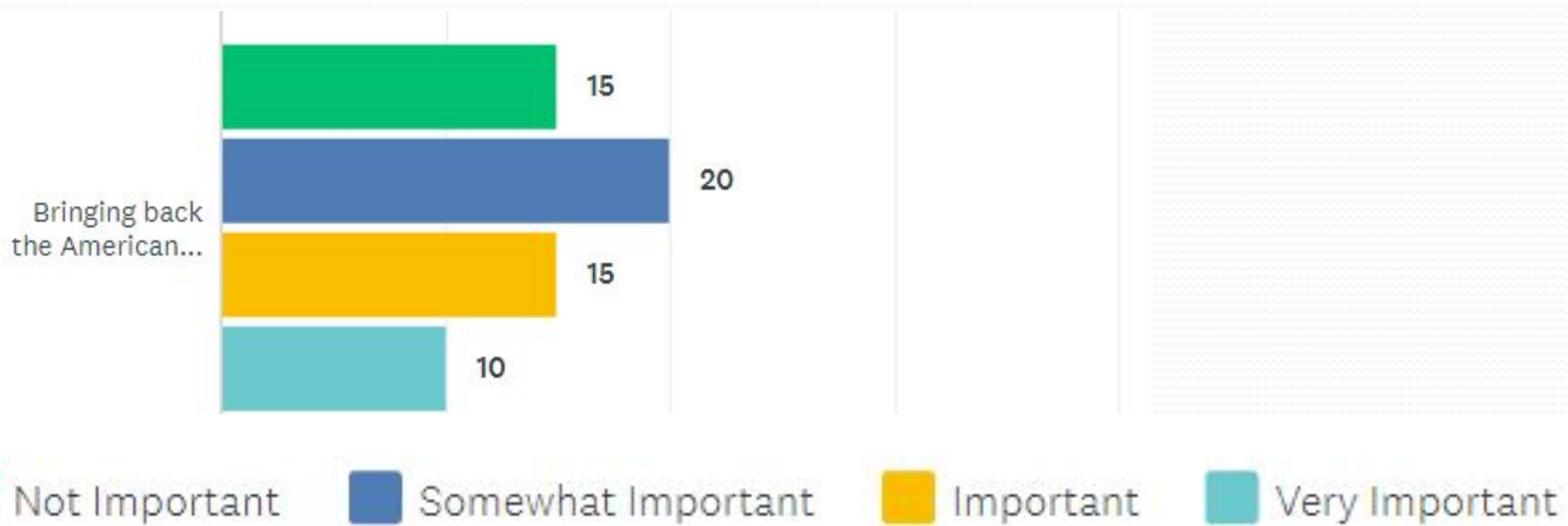
Ranking – Emergency egress for Bassi Road
