ROLL CALL: *Called to order by Chairman Smart at 6 pm with Pesses, Horton, Smart, Peterson present. Patterson, Stirling, Hillendahl absent.*

FLAG SALUTE: *Led by Pesses.*

ADOPT AGENDA: *Moved by Peterson, 2nd by Smart, passed unanimously.*

APPROVE: *3-15-18 DRAFT MINUTES - Moved by Horton, 2nd by Pesses, passed unanimously*

OPEN FORUM:

Public testimony will be received on each agenda item as it is called. Matters not on the agenda may be addressed by the general public during the Open Forum. Public comments during Open Forum are limited to three minutes per person. The Committee reserves the right to waive said rules by majority vote.

-Kris Payne recently attended a Parks and Recreation meeting. A consultant spoke about what they've been working on and pursuing funding for new parks with a 3 prong approach,

Community, Regional and Quimby. The Railroad Park in El Dorado, related to the trails, continues to see growth and use.

-Dianne Murillo- re Mo Flat Design Guidelines. She is wondering if this Committee has seen or heard anything about the Missouri Flat Design Guidelines being on the BOS agenda (consent calendar) for final approval on April 24th? Also wondering if this Committee has seen anything about any new building design plans for the proposed MRF improvements, and she believes it exists in the historical overlay district.

TOPICS:

1. El Dorado County Department of Transportation staff will discuss several upcoming activities regarding the 2019 Active Transportation Program (ATP). Specifically, DOT would like to provide an overview on proposed applications that the DOT and/or Caltrans may be submitting in the Diamond Springs/El Dorado area and receive community input.—**Rob Peters, Sr.Planer, with EDCDOT presenting.**

Peters shared that DOT is currently planning to apply for two Active Transportation Program (ATP) grants, due July 31, 2018, for: 1. Mo Flat over-crossing, connecting the trails (Previously application for this was denied), and 2. A variety of pedestrian and bicycle improvements in the Herbert Green school area (along with the Safe Routes to Schools Act). Also, DOT is actively engaged with CalTrans in applying for grant monies for Class 1 bike lanes and improvements along Pleasant Valley Road, from Missouri Flat Road to Koki Lane (for Class 1 bike lanes). Dustin Harrington, EDCDOT, also attended tonights meeting and gave a brief update on the Diamond Springs Parkway project. Phase 1A going before the BOS to request advertising for construction, which should begin this summer, hopefully, and completion by the end of year 2019. Phase 1B construction is anticipated to begin in 2021, and DOT is currently working on all of the necessary work to get that off the ground. El Dorado Trail extension project from Missouri Flat Road to El Dorado Railroad Park scheduled for 2019. Pedestrian Over-Crossing (POC) is being planned for to connect the El Dorado Trail on both sides of Missouri Flat Road, but funding is non-existent at this time (seeking grant monies), and utility under grounding is also being looked at and planned for in this area. A new Diamond Springs under-ground utility district is scheduled to be presented before the BOS on May 8, 2pm, hopefully for approval. Dianne Murillo brought up DS Parkway project and the future possible extension of it east of Highway 49 and presented some historical evidence that a different alignment had been previously discussed, and she wonders why it can't be changed to realign with something other than the Piedmont Oaks subdivision project for future possible extension to the east, as was originally discussed as a need in the earliest planning stages of the Diamond Springs Parkway project.
