Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Caldor Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

- **Alternate Program**
 - 5221 Butte Creek Road- Soil Sample results submitted. Waiting on final close out paperwork from the contractor. *No changes from previous report cycle*
 - 4991 Sciaroni Rd (USPS) – USPS submitted another Final Summary report which was missing waste removal documentation and an arborist report. EMD reached out to the consultant to discuss the deficiencies.

Land Use

- **Fee Waivers** – 139 received
 - Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
 - 85 Received
 - 99 Approved (even if they didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for a fee waiver, TRV/TMH permit fees are included in the approved waiver along with the requested permit fees to avoid the need for additional fee waiver requests/approval should the need the TRV/TMH permit)
- **Single Family Home Rebuild Permits** – 76 received
 - Replacement Home Permits – 62 received, 32 issued, 30 pending
 - Home Repair Permits – 10 received, 3 issued, 7 pending
 - Convert Mobile Home to Permanent Permits – 4 received, 3 issued, 1 pending
- **TRV Permits** – 51 Received
 - 40 Issued
 - 11 Pending

Health and Human Services Agency

- **Long-Term Recovery**
