CLEAN AIR CENTERS

The El Dorado County Air Quality Management District is proud to announce, in partnership with the El Dorado County Libraries, the successful award of funding under the Wildfire Smoke Clean Air Centers for Vulnerable Populations Incentive Pilot Program. These funds were made available through Assembly Bill 836 to provide air cleaning equipment to create a statewide network of Clean Air Centers, to help mitigate the adverse public health impacts during wildfire smoke events.

This Clean Air Center grant funding has allowed for the purchase of 29 large HEPA air purifiers for use in the County libraries in Placerville, South Lake Tahoe, Cameron Park, Georgetown, and Pollock Pines. When outdoor air quality conditions meet unhealthy criteria, the air purifiers will be operated at these locations to provide a public indoor space to breath cleaner, healthier air.

California wildfires have increased in severity and intensity, particularly in the past few years. These fires also produce heavy smoke that has blanketed communities for days or even weeks at a time, creating significant exposures to particulate matter and air toxics for the people in these communities. The Clean Air Centers at the locations listed below will provide vulnerable populations a respite from wildfires and other smoke events.
