


# Parks, Recreation and Tourism in the South Shore

Feedback from these workshops will be used to develop recommendations in two recreation planning efforts in the South Shore:

- ◆ *Parks, Trails and Recreation Master Plan* (South Lake Tahoe and El Dorado County)
- ◆ *Tahoe Basin Recreation and Tourism Plan* (Douglas County)

### Each Vision Roundtable will include

- ◆ A short PowerPoint presentation on the region's park and recreation resources.
- ◆ Small group discussions on the strategies and actions needed to improve recreation opportunities in the area for residents and tourists.
- ◆ A large group discussion of the community's vision for recreation in the future and the role it should play in enhancing economic vitality.
